CHRISTMAS WEEK WORSHIP:

Longest Night Worship on Dec 20: The Christmas season is not a joy filled time for everyone, especially for those who are mourning the first Christmas without a loved one, and those who are dealing with difficult life experiences. The Longest Night service is an opportunity to slow down and acknowledge the places where the season is difficult for you, and for those you love. Join us for quiet worship and prayer as we note the turning of the seasons from dark to light, finding God's comfort in the dark, and holding on to hope with the coming of the light.

The Morning of Christmas Eve: 9am Worship on December 24th will be an informal time of scripture, prayer, and carols. We are on the edge of birth, family gathered to support each other while awaiting the announcement of birth. After worship, we'll have caramel rolls and coffee to celebrate the beginning of the season.

SCHEDULE: Because of Advent services and the school break, the schedule for 5th-8th grade classes is as follows: **7th-8th grade**, Dec 20 - 3:30-4:30, **All**: no classes Dec 27

SHARING THE PEACE IN COLD AND FLU SEASON: As cold and flu season is nearing, please remember that some people may be more comfortable with an alternative method of sharing the peace, such as an elbow bump, a small bow, the "namaste" gesture, a peace sign or wave.

THE MORE YOU KNOW: We have started the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) Year B, which is known as the year of Mark. The RCL is a 3 year lectionary, with one year each assigned to Matthew, Mark and Luke. John's gospel is quite different from the first three, so was not assigned a year of its own. Instead, readings from John appear occasionally throughout the 3 year cycle, especially in Year B. This is because the gospel of Mark is very short - only 16 chapters - so readings from John fill out the year. Personal observation from Pastor Ramona: John is my favorite gospel, and I wish we read more of it!
