cold and flu season is nearing, please remember that some people may be more comfortable with an alternative method of sharing the peace, such as an elbow bump, a small bow, the "namaste" gesture, a peace sign or wave.

QUARTERS FOR LAUNDRY WITH LOVE: This is an ongoing service project sponsored by the confirmation and preconfirmation youth. Take one of the labeled pill bottles and as you get loose change, put the quarters in the bottle. When filled, bring back and place in the laundry soap container. We will periodically send the quarters to Church on the Street for their Laundry with Love nights.

LET'S READ THE GOSPEL OF MARK TOGETHER! Mark's gospel is the shortest one - only 16 chapters. Pastor Ramona challenges you to read the entire gospel between January 7th and Feb 11th. Pastor Ramona will be posting each day on the day's assigned readings and you are invited to comment with questions, concerns and insights. There also will be a Zoom study on Sundays at 7:30pm starting on Jan 14. Pick up a copy of the reading schedule on the ushers' table.

THE MORE YOU KNOW: We have started the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) Year B, which is known as the year of Mark. The RCL is a 3 year lectionary, with one year each assigned to Matthew, Mark and Luke. John's gospel is quite different from the first three, so was not assigned a year of its own. Instead, readings from John appear occasionally throughout the 3 year cycle, especially in Year B. This is because the gospel of Mark is very short - only 16 chapters - so readings from John fill out the year. Personal observation from Pastor Ramona: John is my favorite gospel, and I wish we read more of it!

THE WAY WE TREAT PEOPLE who don't have a place to stay is the best way to describe what the manger means. If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person? Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth. 1 John 3:17-18.
